From the Associate Pastor's Pen...

“Would You Dare to Rob God?”

Would anyone ever consider doing that? Well, yes they would! There are several good examples in the Bible. With human nature being what it is, it is likely many people are robbing him today.

One of the main texts dealing with this is in Malachi 3:6,8 -10. God speaks through the prophet and says, *“For I the Lord do not change; therefore you, O children of Jacob, are not consumed. (That’s good news for all of us, for we all fall short of God’s standards in some way.) “Will man rob God? Yet you are robbing me. But you say, ‘How have we robbed you?’ In your tithes and contributions. You are cursed with a curse, for you are robbing me, the whole nation of you. Bring the full tithe (10%) into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of Hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need.”*

Yes, this was an Old Testament covenant instruction, and we don’t view it as a “requirement” for New Testament Christians. But it does give us a glimpse into what pleases God. Many believe that this is a good goal or guideline and have testified that God has poured out blessings on them when they have given ten percent or more.

Furthermore, the New Testament does stress the importance of our returning to God part of what He has given to us. 2 Corinthians 9:6 gives us a promise also: *“The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.”*

Now, why am I tackling such a sensitive subject at this time? Well, there is concern that we might fall behind and not be able to pay our bills over the summer. Many people at St. Mark have given regularly and generously, and with the blessing of God we have been able to meet our obligations so far. But with the struggling economy and the relocation of some of our members, supporting our ministry is a constant challenge. Then, too, I understand that there are a significant number of members who contribute little or nothing to this ministry.

Here are some things to consider as we work together as Christians to meet this challenge:

- 1) Pray about this, both for yourself and for others.
- 2) Put what you will return to the Lord aside FIRST. Then move on in faith and trust that God will provide for you with what is left.
- 3) Have a goal for your giving and stick to it. It does not have to be ten percent, but you should be aware of what percent you are returning for kingdom work
- 4) Don’t fail to return an offering to God because you missed church or were away on vacation. We have pretty much the same bills each month.
- 5) Invite others to church, including missing members. It is the Holy Spirit working through the Word than changes hearts and strengthens our faith. (see Philippians 2:13 below)

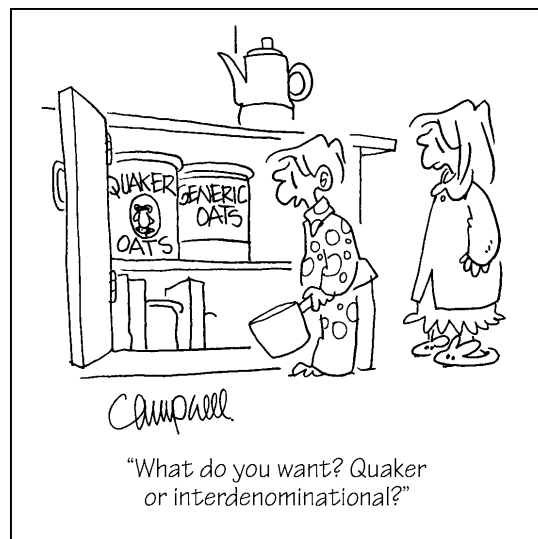
Summary of June 13 Meeting Minutes

If you are using the computer to make your choices, there is a box towards the bottom of the page that will allow you to list the place of your choice, so be prepared with name, city, state and any other information you have in order to list this **Lutheran** organization. Thrivent will then call them and get a routing number from their bank account so that your wishes may be met.

Please be aware that: let's say 14 people at St. Mark choose to send their **Choice Dollars** to St. Mark Church in Chesterland, Ohio for a total of \$3500. The church will receive that total amount but they will not be told who sent how much money. You will need to keep the letter you received from Thrivent in order to have a tax donation amount for the IRS. Thrivent is hoping this will provide a fairer way of donating the monies that you have earned by being a Thrivent Financial member.

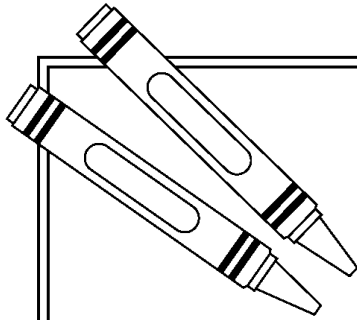
